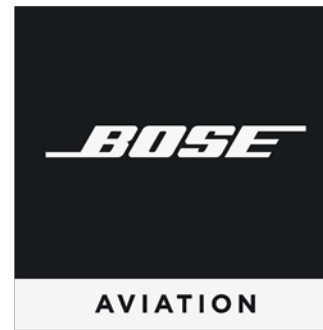
- Which approach did you choose? Why?
